- Mr. D: Good morning, Sharon. How're you today?  
Sharon: Pretty good, Mr. D'Agostino.  
Mr. D: What'll it be?  
Sharon: Just coffee and a Danish, please.  
Mr. D: You look tired.  
Sharon: Aw, it's all the studying I've been doing.  
Mr. D: Ah, for the finals?  
Sharon: Yes. I'll be glad when they're all over.  
Mr. D: Yeah, I can imagine.  
Sharon: [*sigh*] Next year maybe I'll finally get myself to study more during the school year. (Mr. D: Mm-hm.) Then I wouldn't have to go so crazy at the end.  
Mr. D: Yeah, that's the mistake everybody makes. Well, just do your best, huh? And take care of yourself, will you? You'll get sick if keep going like this.  
Sharon: I know. But this is the last week. I'll make it.  
Mr. D: How many more exams do you have?  
Sharon: Just one more. The last one, but the most important — economics. That'll be the day after tomorrow, (Mr. D: Mm.) on Wednesday.  
Mr. D: OK, here's your coffee, (S: Thanks.) ... and your Danish. So. After Wednesday you'll be able to relax?  
Sharon: Yes.  
Mr. D: Good. Well, you look like you need some rest. [*pause*] Just a minute.  
Sharon: What?  
Mr. D: You know, the economics exam isn't until next week.  
Sharon: No. It's *this* Wednesday. The day after tomorrow.  
Mr. D: Are you sure?  
Sharon: Of course I'm sure.  
Mr. D: Hmm. I don't know — you're in the same class as Tony Rivers, aren't you?  
Sharon: Yes.  
Mr. D: Well, he just told me that the economics exam isn't until next Wednesday.  
Sharon: Well, I suppose I could check the schedule again.  
Mr. D: Yeah, you better. That's kind of important.  
Sharon: I was right. It's this week. Tony must've made a mistake.  
Mr. D: Well, you better go tell him then. He's sitting over in the corner near the window drinking his morning coffee and reading a newspaper ... just like he didn't have a worry in the world.

Sharon: I certainly will.

Tony: Ah, g'mornin', Sharon. C'mon over here, have a seat.

Sharon: May I join you?

Tony: Sure. Nice day, isn't it?

Sharon: [*under her breath*] For the rest of the world.

Tony: Huh?

Sharon: It's a nice day, but I'm afraid it's going to get bad *real* fast.

Tony: What do you mean. They're predicting rain?

Sharon: Tears, maybe.

Tony: What's the matter? You think you've failed the exams?

Sharon: No. How about you?

Tony: Naw! Passed'em all with flying colors. Couple of them were hard, but I'm sure I passed. The most important one — economics exam — isn't until next week. I have a whole week to study.

Sharon: Have you studied for the economics test much yet?

Tony: [*laughs*] Are you kidding? I haven't started. I got a whole week.

Sharon: You haven't got a week.

Tony: What do you mean?

Sharon: Well ... The exam's on Wednesday.

Tony: Yeah, right, next Wednesday. Not this Wednesday.

Sharon: No, Tony. This Wednesday. The day after tomorrow.

Tony: [*laughs*] What a sense of humor. You should be on TV.

Sharon: No joke. Look at the schedule. [*rustle of paper*]

Tony: [*to himself*] ... Look at this ... here it is ... economics ...  
[*to Sharon again:*] Get me another cup of coffee.

Sharon: Tony ...

Tony: A cup of coffee! Quick!

Sharon: [*calls*] Mr. D'Agostino — could you bring me a cup of coffee, please?

Mr. D: Sure.

Tony: What am I going to do ... ? [*rambling to himself*]  
Destroy the test papers, that's what I'll do ... Blow up the faculty building!  
Set fire to the examination hall!

Sharon: Hey, hey, control yourself.

Tony: Get *control* of myself??? What're you — ... You understand the mess I'm in?

Sharon: It's not that bad. You've got all day today, tonight and all day tomorrow and tomorrow night to study.

Tony: Ah. Thanks for the coffee, Mr. D'Agostino. (Mr. D: Sure.) [*sips like crazy on the coffee*] Ah ... Little bit of sugar ... little cream ...

Mr. D: Take it easy, boy.

Tony: What'll I do ...? Ah — My brother! My brother's got a beach house. I could - I - I could stay at my brother's beach house.

Sharon: Oh, sure. Do that. (T: I'll just - ) Yeah. Sounds great. By all means.

Tony: I'll just ... just go there, and it's quiet, and ... I could study. There're no distractions, and ... quiet, and ... just - just study (S: Yeah.) just study (S: Mm.) right through (S: Definitely.) to Wednesday.

Sharon: Yes, definitely do that. But don't go crazy all of a sudden — don't get nervous or excited, or anything like that. You won't be able to get anything done.

Tony: You finished your coffee? Uh — Let me have yours. Just a minute. [*gulps*] You're right ...  
Just stay cool, calm ... Study hard ... Plenty of time till next Wednesday ... NOW HOLD IT ... How can anyone study all that in two days?  
It's not possible. What I should be doing right now is ... panicking!

Sharon: Whatever you do, don't panic. You'll just get yourself *more* excited.

Tony: [*distracted*] Well, help me then! T - teach me economics. Right now.

Sharon: Oh, don't be silly.

Tony: I don't know what else to do — I'll have to cheat.

Sharon: Uh — Whatever you do, don't cheat, Tony. You're not that kind of guy.

Tony: I'm trapped in a corner, Sharon. [*pause*] The best thing for me to do is ... try to get a ... copy of the test paper.

Sharon: Uh — Stop thinking like that.

Tony: Where are the test papers kept? In the dean's office? Uh - uh - uh economics department office? Uh, I'll have to wait until tonight and ... and break in.

Sharon: Mm. By all means.

Tony: Smash a window. Search the offices. Find the test. Make a photocopy.

Sharon: Oh, that's a fine idea.

Tony: You think so?

Sharon: Yeah. Great — getting yourself arrested, kicked out of college, getting your name in the newspaper, a criminal record, giving your father gray hairs. Just a great idea, Tony. By all means do it.

Tony: [*deflated*] Well then ... then I'll have to cheat during the exam.

Sharon: If you're caught, you'll get thrown out. Definitely don't cheat, Tony.

Tony: But if I don't do something, I'll fail.

Sharon: Is that so bad? Is that the end of the world?

Tony: 'Course it is! What am I going to do?

Sharon: Uh, I don't know ...

Tony: Ah - m - my advisor! That's it - my advisor. He's my only hope. I'll go see him and ... explain the whole situation.

Sharon: Yes. That may be the best thing to do.

Tony: I'll explain everything. He ... he'll think of a way to help me. Yeah ... Come on, let's go see him.

Sharon: Well — aren't you going to finish your coffee?

Tony: This is no time for coffee. Come on, let's go.

Mr. D: Good luck, Tony! We're all in there with you! I know you can do it. Get hold of yourself, boy. It'll be all right. Calm down.
