
1 6 /θ/ CONTRASTED WITH /s/



/θ/は、日本人にとって発音しにくい音の一つである。 そのために、 SINK と THINK などの語は誤って発音されやすい。ここでは、/s/と/θ/ を比較しながら練習する。/θ/の発音では舌を上の歯先に触れさせること が大切である。

Let's begin by reviewing the pronunciation of θ . Look at the diagram and repeat these words beginning with θ .

Next, repeat some pairs of sentences.

- It's a good pass.

 It's a good path.
- It's a bit sick. It's a bit thick.
- What a nice mouse! What a nice mouth!

Then, practice these trick sentences.

The combination of $/\theta$ and /s in adjoining words also needs practice. Repeat

- The north side of town. /norθ sayd/

- Now listen to a list of sentences spoken by the teacher. If a sentence has /s/, hold up one finger; if θ /, hold up two fingers.
